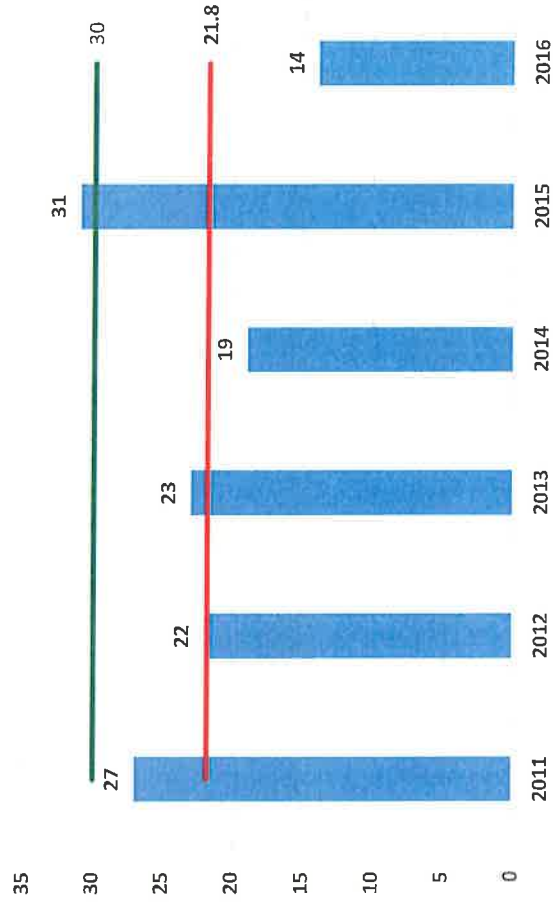


Homicides and Non-Fatal Shootings

- Homicides are down 54.8% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Non-Fatal shooting incidents are up 2.6% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Current 5 year average (2012-2016) for homicides is 21.8. The previous 5 year average (2007-2011) was 30.0.
- Current 5 year average (2012-2016) for non-fatal shootings is 105.8. The previous 5 year average (2007-2011) is 133.8.



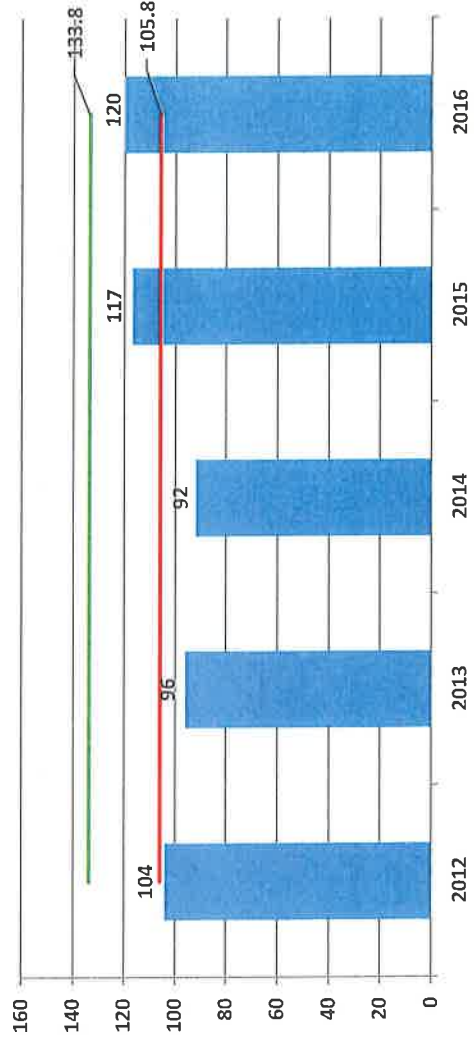
Homicides



- Homicides are down 36.4% in 2016 when compared to 2012.
- Homicides are down 54.8% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Current 5 year average(2012-2016) for homicides is 21.8 (red line).
- The previous 5 year average(2007-2011) was 30.0 (green line).
- Overall 10 year average is 25.9.



Non-Fatal Shootings



- Non-Fatal shooting incidents are up 2.6% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Current 5 year average(2012-2016) for non-fatal shootings is 105.8 (red line).
- The previous 5 year average(2007-2011) is 133.8 (green line).
- Overall 10 year average is 119.8.

*In 2010, the FBI changed reporting requirements for persons struck by gunfire to include each person struck as a separate incident. Applying this requirement to prior years would result in an undetermined number of additional shooting incidents.

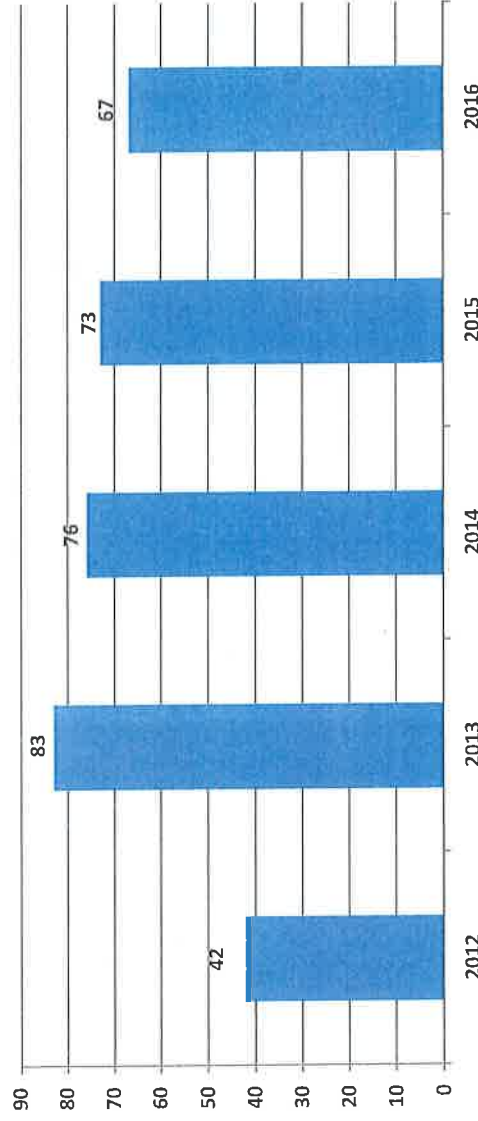


Violent Crime

- Sexual Assaults are down 8.2% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Robbery incidents are down 7.4% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Aggravated Assaults are down 4.7% in 2016 when compared to 2015.



Sex Assault

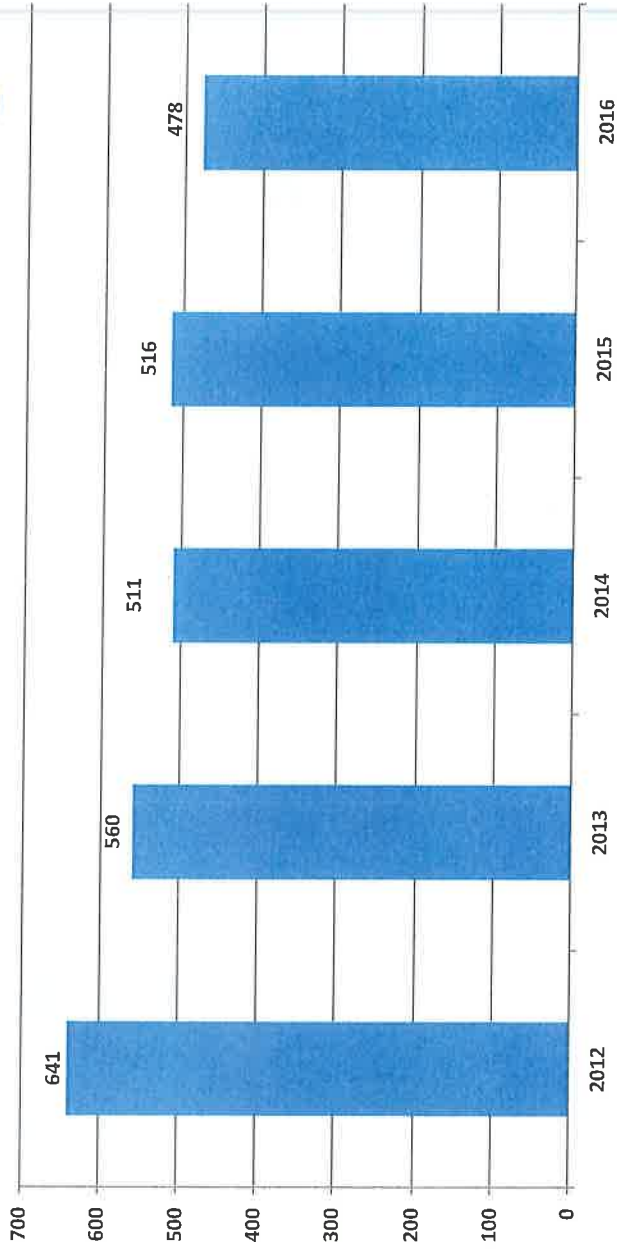


- Sexual Assaults are up 59.5% in 2016 when compared to 2012.
- Sexual Assaults were down 8.2% in 2016 when compared to 2015.

*In 2013, the FBI expanded the definition of sexual assault to mean penetration, no matter how slight, of the personal orifices of another without consent.



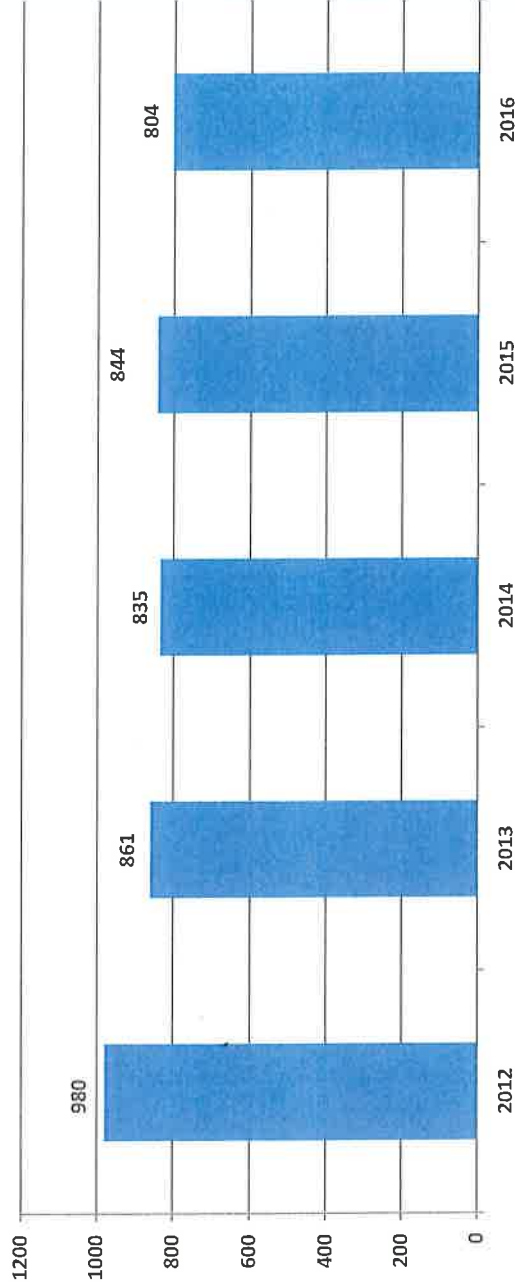
Robbery



- Robbery incidents are down 7.4% in 2016 when compared to 2015.



Aggravated Assaults



- Aggravated Assaults are down 18% in 2016 when compared to 2012.
- Aggravated Assaults are down 4.7% in 2016 when compared to 2015.

*The FBI defines aggravated assault as "an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm".

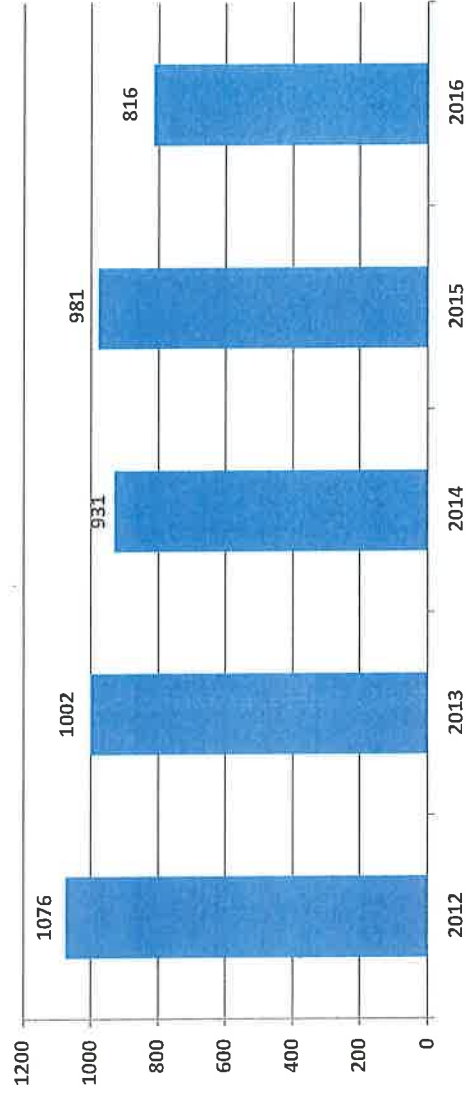


Property Crimes

- Burglary incidents are down 4.7% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Larceny incidents are down 2.1% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Larcenies accounted for 55.2% of all Part One Crimes in 2016.
- Shoplifting, Car Breaks, and License Plate thefts account for 67.4% of all larcenies.
- Auto Thefts are down 14.6% in 2016 when compared to 2015. Older Hondas and Toyotas continue to be the most targeted vehicles for theft.



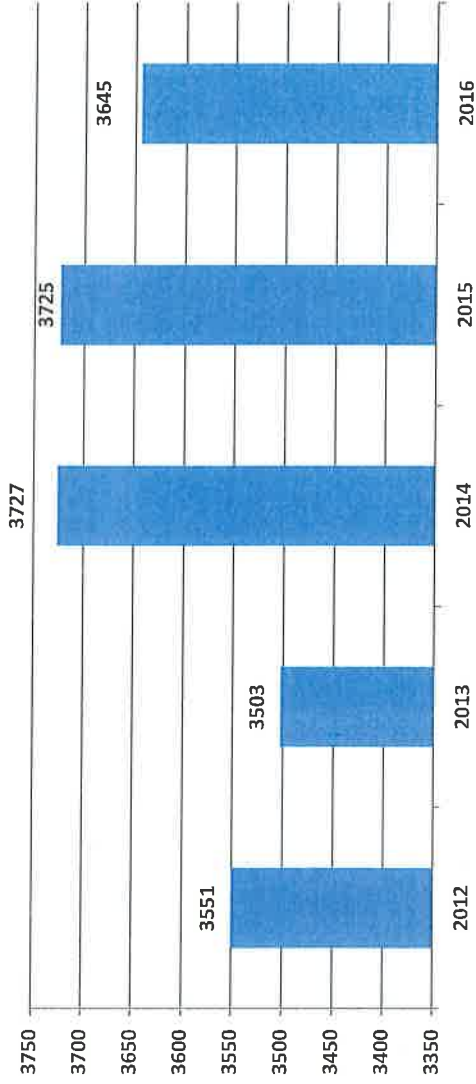
Burglary



- Burglaries are down 4.7% in 2016 when compared to 2015.



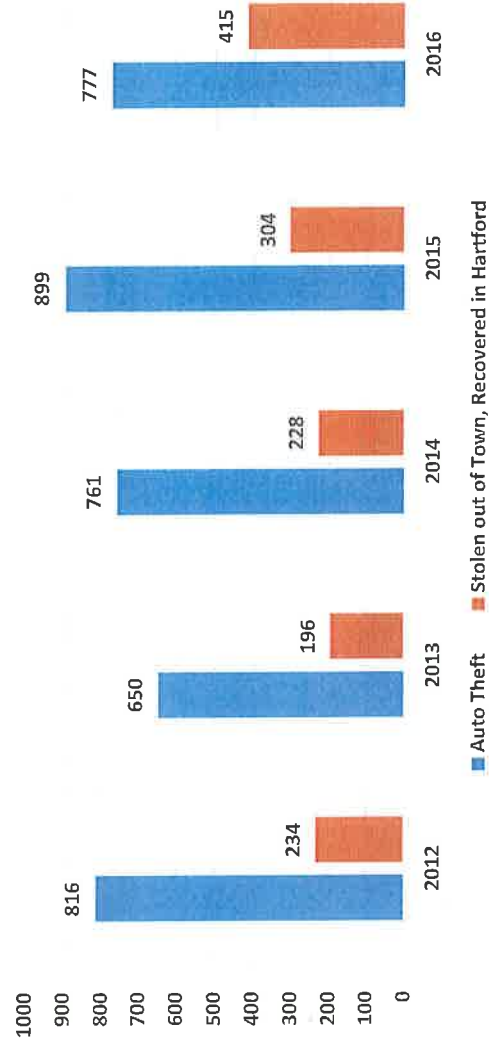
Larceny



- Larceny incidents are up 2.6% in 2016 when compared to 2012.
- Larceny incidents were down 2.1% in 2016 when compared to 2015.



Auto Theft



- Auto Thefts are down 14.6% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Stolen vehicles from other towns recovered in Hartford are up 36.5% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Older model Hondas and Toyotas continue to be the most targeted vehicles

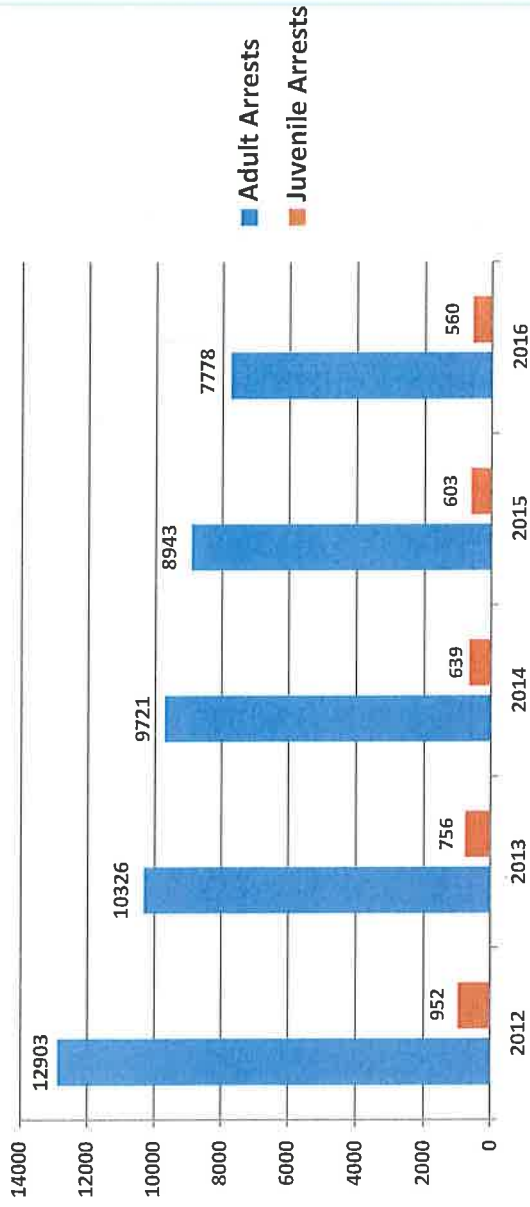


Annual Arrests

- Adult arrests are down 13% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Adult arrests are down 39.7% in 2016 when compared to 2012.
- Juvenile arrests are down 7.1% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Juvenile arrests are down 41.2% in 2016 when compared to 2012.
- 653 misdemeanor summons were issued in the last six months of 2016.



Adult/Juvenile Arrests



- Adult arrests are down 13% in 2016 when compared to 2015.
- Juvenile arrests are down 7.1% in 2016 when compared to 2015.

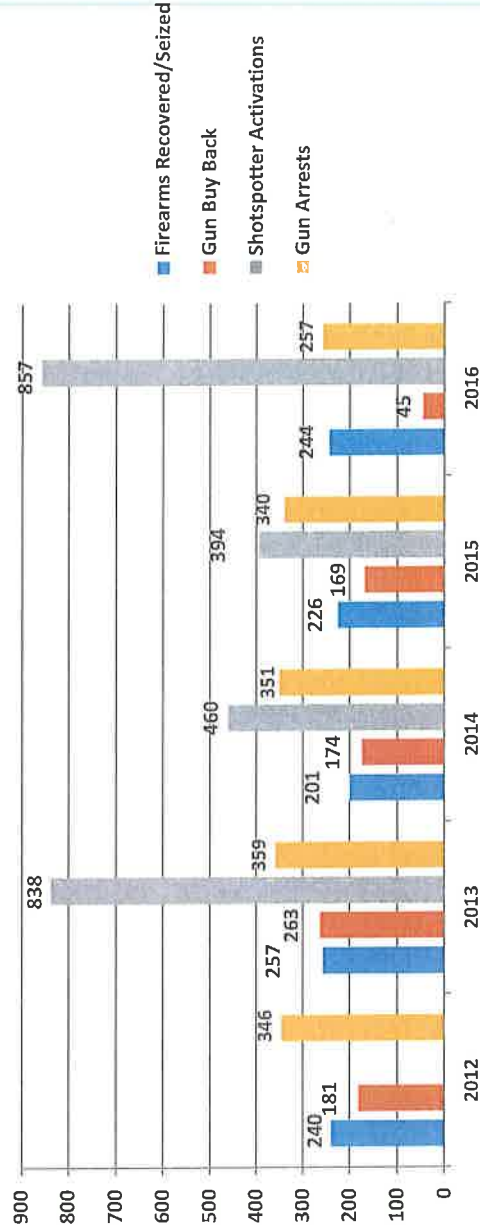


Firearms Seizures/ ShotSpotter

- Total of 289 firearms recovered/seized in 2016.
- Includes guns collected at gun buyback programs.
- ShotSpotter detected 394 incidents in 2015.
- ShotSpotter detected 857 incidents in 2016, for an increase of 117.5%.
- City coverage of ShotSpotter sensors expanded in 2016 to cover all residential areas.



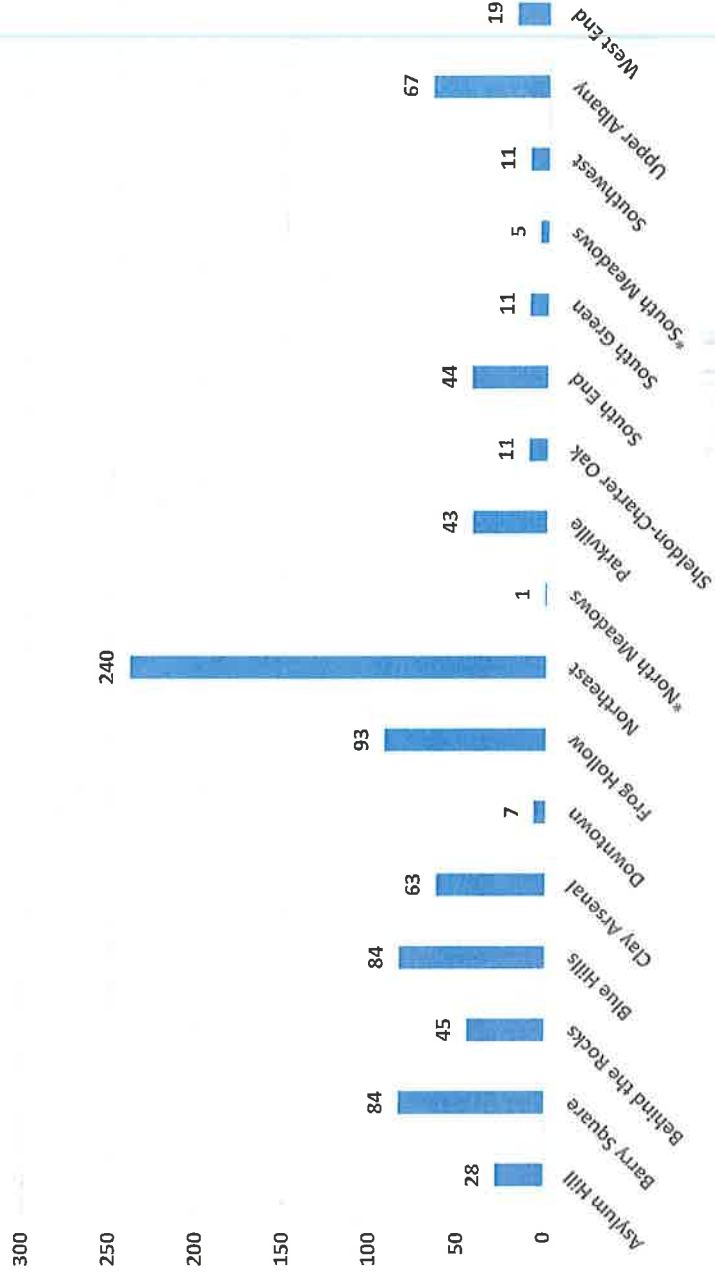
Firearms Recovered/Gun Buy Back/ShotSpotter Activations



- Total of 2,430 firearms recovered/seized since 2012. This includes 289 in 2016.
- In 2015 ShotSpotter detected 394 incidents.
- In 2016 ShotSpotter detected 857 incidents for an increase of 117.5%



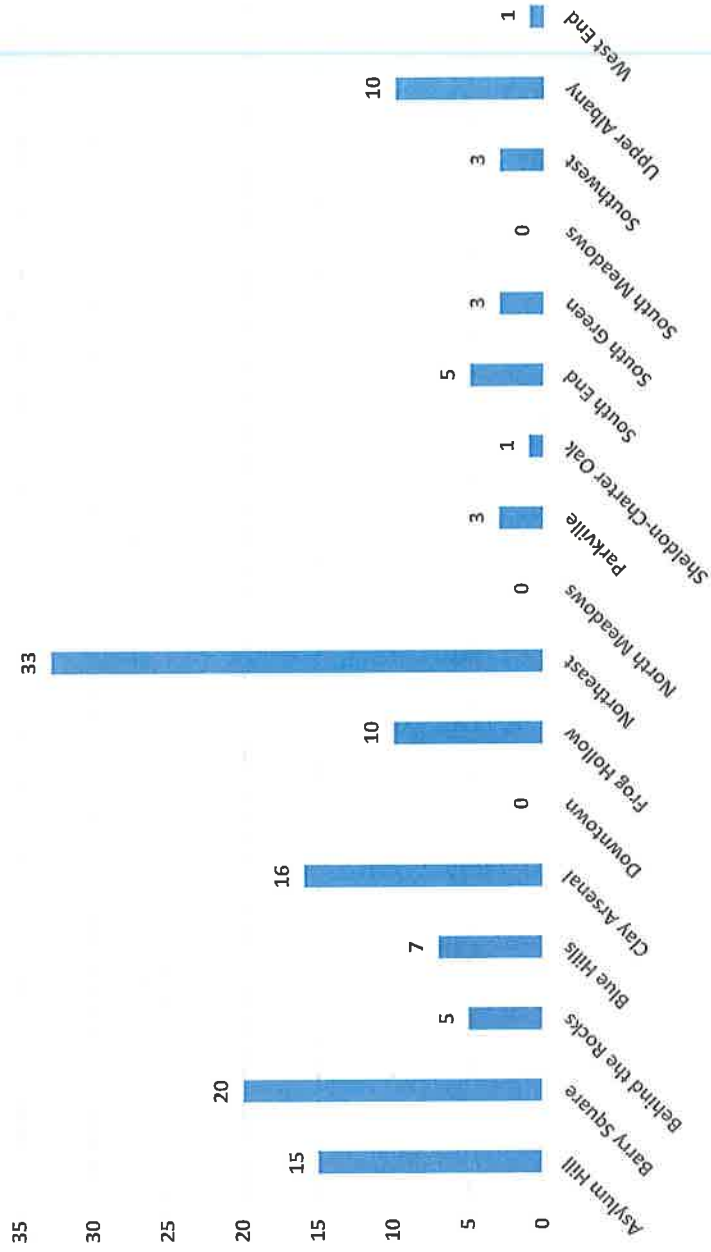
2016 ShotSpotter Activations by Neighborhood



* Not covered, but gunshots are detected in these neighborhoods due to proximity of other sensors.

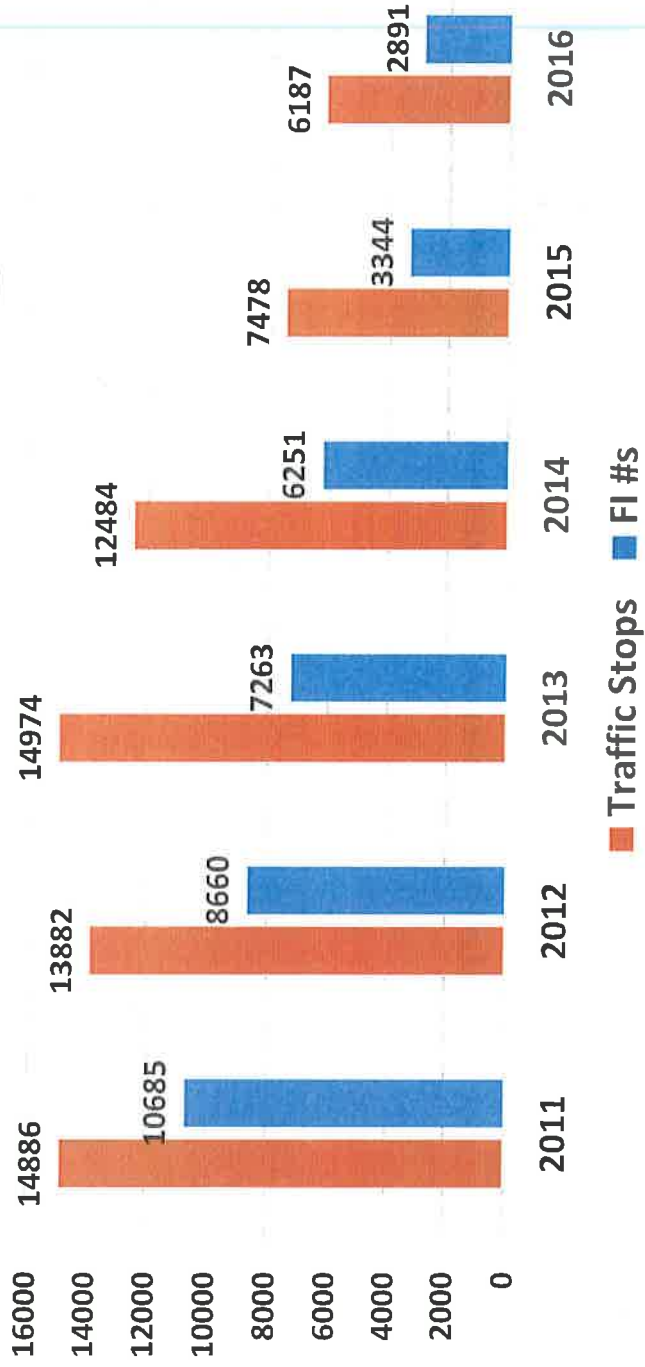


2016 Persons Struck by Gunfire by Neighborhood
