WRVO to host NPR midday news presenter and journalist Lakshmi Singh
Syracuse University alum to speak at October luncheon

WRVO Public Media will host NPR midday newscaster **Lakshmi Singh** at an informal luncheon at the Genesee Grande Hotel in Syracuse Friday, October 4th. The invitation-only event is one of a series that will include a meeting with students at the **Newhouse School of Public Communication** at Syracuse University and a lecture in the **Cazenovia Forum** series in Cazenovia.

Singh joined NPR's award-winning Newscast Unit in 2000. Her experience extends beyond the studio booth to domestic and international field reporting. From comprehensive coverage of the infamous sniper shootings in the Washington, DC, area to in-depth feature reporting on immigration from both sides of the border, Singh's stories reflect the magic of radio. While in Haiti as a documentary producer for Soundprint she uncovered compelling stories of women struggling to live with HIV/AIDS while the politically embattled government in Haiti was on the verge of collapse.

As a regular contributor to NPR's Latino USA, Singh is passionate about issues that affect Hispanics today. The diversity questions Singh has faced due to her biracial background (Singh's mother is Puerto Rican, her father is from Trinidad) have led her to take unconventional approaches to many stories.

Before coming to NPR, Singh was a reporter for Syracuse University station WAER and a local host and reporter at NPR member stations KPBX in Spokane, WMFE in Orlando, and WAMU in Washington.

Singh has also contributed to PRI and the Voice of America.

Lakshmi Singh graduated from Syracuse University with a bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism and Latin American studies.

Community Health Forum series event held in Watertown, slated for Utica in November

WRVO Public Media held another in our series of health forums Wednesday, September 25 at Jefferson Community College, Watertown. Panelists included Thomas H. Carman, CEO of Samaritan Medical Center; Richard Kazel, Veterans Affairs (VA); and Denise Young, Executive Director of the Fort Drum Regional Health Planning Organization (FDRHPO). Catherine Loper, Director of News and Public Affairs at WRVO, moderated the discussion. The panel was recorded to air at a later date and will be archived on the WRVO website.

The forum, funded in part by the **Health Foundation of Western and Central New York**, explored how upstate New York communities deal with providing health care to veterans and members of the military; the health care issues veterans and active military in our community are dealing with currently, such as the issues that arise from our country's decade-plus of overseas wars; the impact of the changing civilian health care system on veterans and military members; and how veteran and military health care affects communities - creating jobs and providing connections between civilian and military worlds.

The next forum will focus on mental health issues and will be held in Utica in November. Stay tuned to WRVO for details.

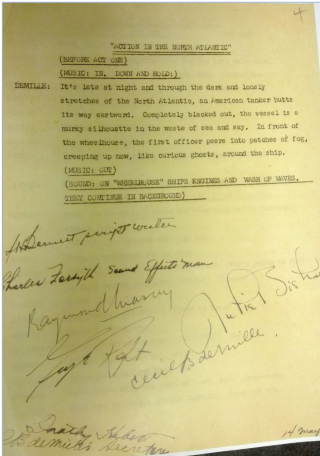

WRVO's collection of old-time radio shows is one of the most extensive anywhere, and *Tuned To Yesterday*, WRVO's nightly two hour broadcast of radio shows from the golden era - 1930s to 1950s network radio - attracts listeners from around the world. We often receive donations from personal collections containing old shows on tape, but rarely do we receive donations of scripts or other memorabilia

associated with those programs. Recently a package arrived at the station containing a photocopy of a very special script, "Action in the North Atlantic," one in a series of WWII-era shows heard on the Lux Radio Theater.

The show is in the WRVO archive and the script has a great local angle. The anonymous donor's uncle, an American GI on leave in May of 1944, found himself at the famous USO hangout, the **Hollywood Canteen**, where soldiers could relax and become friendly with celebrity volunteers who boosted morale by serving food, chatting with servicemen and putting on free shows.

A tap on the shoulder from **S.H. Barnett**, head script writer for **The Lux Radio Theater**, led to a memorable encounter with the cast of one of the most famous shows in radio history. Before long the soldier was shaking hands with actor **Raymond Massey**, actress **Julie Bishop**, and producer/host **Cecil B. DeMille**, the legendary movie director. The stunned GI was given a tour of the sound effects table by master foley artist **Charles Forsyth** and handed an autographed copy of the script. "I even had DeMille's secretary sign the darn thing!" he exclaimed.

Today, nearly 70 years later, this unique piece of radio history illustrates how talented actors breathed life into the printed page to create some of the most memorable broadcasts ever presented in the theater of the mind. A very big thank you to our anonymous Syracuse listener for this donation!

Based on a 2012 survey conducted by the SUNY Levin Institute's Center for an Urban Future, New York in the World includes interviews with members of the business community, economists, historians and New York State residents discussing effects of globalization on the New York economy. Producer Sidsel Overgaard visited a sprawling General Motors plant near Buffalo to interview workers, and to Rochester to gain insights into how the regional workforce has fared since the collapse of regional powerhouse Kodak. The executive summary of the original survey describes the initial research as the first comprehensive report documenting globalization's economic impact on New York State and City. It proclaims no other state has benefitted more - or suffered worse - than New York.

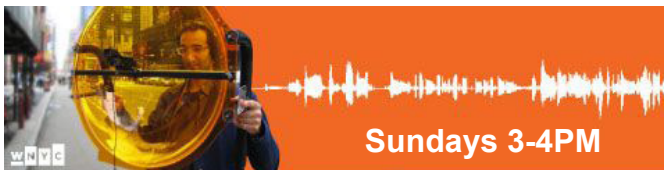

October is 'all hands on deck' month at WRVO. October sets the stage for everything we will do going forward into next year. October is the month in which we come to you, our listeners, to ask for your financial support. How well you respond this year will make all the difference.

WRVO is extremely fortunate to have a loyal member base, and we are supported by committed businesses and organizations that make contributions in exchange for on-air promotional announcements. SUNY Oswego, our biggest and incredibly supportive partner, matches member donations with financial and in-kind services.

We do not take any of this for granted. In fact one key source of support, our long-standing Community Service Grant from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, is at risk to both the ongoing federal budget sequester and efforts in Congress to eliminate public broadcasting completely from the federal budget. In 2011-2012 WRVO's grant was \$211,000. This year the grant was pared back to \$187,000. Restoration is unlikely.

Be assured we live within our means. We do not run deficits, do stick to our budget and do plan for the long term. We have a lean staff. My compensation as General Manager, for example, is the lowest salary on the payroll (I have a dual role as GM and academic administrator at SUNY Oswego). We are determined to fulfill WRVO's mission whatever the financial circumstances.

But we need a strong, positive response to the fall fundraising appeal. Please pass the word to neighbors, friends and acquaintances that WRVO Public Media is a worthy investment in the quality of life here in CNY.

Before signing off I want to say what a pleasure it is working with distinguished journalist and educator **Garrick Utley**, newest member of the SUNY Oswego faculty. Some of you will recall his riveting NBC News reports from Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War era. Garrick has every right to rest on his many laurels, but that is not going to happen. The day he walked into the studio in rolled-up sleeves and asked, "How can I help?" we knew we were in for something really special. Indeed we were. The first fruit of that collaboration, the extraordinary documentary *New York in the World*, is already on the air. On behalf of all of us, thank you, Garrick. We are honored to be working with you.
