<b>2</b>	Internship Program ( <i>Spring 2018</i> )	<p>During the Spring semester of this reporting period–January through May 2018–our SEU hosted four (4) students from Stony Brook University. These student interns were supervised by our Long Island Bureau Chief and, with guidance, conducted in-depth, on-the-ground reporting about issues of significance to Long Island on a regular basis. They also produced headlines and occasional short features.</p> <p>Our SEU also hosted one (1) student from Sacred Heart University who was supervised by our News Director and, with guidance, conducted in-depth, on-the-ground reporting about issues of significance to Fairfield and Westport, Connecticut as well as surrounding communities on a regular basis. This Program provides “recent college graduates with work experience in the philanthropic sector” and is designed “to expand, enhance, and diversify the pipeline of new talent entering nonprofit careers.” Fellows are placed at nonprofit organizations in roles aligned with their capabilities and career interests.</p> <p>During this reporting period, our SEU hosted one Newman’s Own Foundation Fellow, a graduate of/a recent graduate of Oberlin College, who expressed an interest in nonprofit public radio broadcasting. The Fellow received hands-on experience and guidance from numerous staff members with respect to all facets of our business and operated as news interns.</p> <p>Our Oberlin graduate also operated as an audio and photo journalist, working closely with our news directors and news department.
