Two-Day Biltmore Estate Trip Itinerary:

Day one (April 26): Depart Clarksburg, WV at 8 a.m. by bus with additional boarding in Charleston at 10 a.m. and Beckley at 11:30 a.m. Savor a special box lunch on the bus and arrive at the **Inn on Biltmore Estate**, Asheville, NC to check in before **dinner**, followed by a **wine tasting and tour of the Winery**. Then, it's off for a tour of the **"Biltmore House--Downstairs!"**

Day Two (April 27): After a refreshing **overnight stay and full breakfast**, enjoy a tour of **"Dressing Downton, Changing Fashion For Changing Times,"** an exhibition of more than 45 costumes from the popular PBS Masterpiece series **Downton Abbey** showcased throughout America's largest home. A **stroll through the conservatory plus the formal and informal gardens** (designed by America's foremost landscape architect, Frederick Law Olmsted) helps to work up an appetite for the **midday meal**. Afterward, we begin our journey home with a light supper along the way.

Located in Asheville, North Carolina, Biltmore was the vision of George W. Vanderbilt. Designed by Richard Morris Hunt, America's largest home is a 250-room French Renaissance chateau, exhibiting the Vanderbilt family's original collection of furnishings, art and antiques. Biltmore estate encompasses more than 8,000 acres including renowned gardens designed by Frederick Law Olmsted, the father of American landscape architecture.
