KPBX first held the sale in 1990 with a few boxes of donated items displayed at REI. Back then, the music and news station was only 10 years old and CDs had just started outselling vinyl.

- CDs will be pre-tested and sealed for security reasons.
- Not everything fits on tabletops.
 More boxes are under the tables!
- Cookies and Craven's Coffee are on the upper balcony, by both ends near the stage area.
- Maps of the genre and format layout are at the front door.
