Fiddle Master Michael Doucet Brings the Cajun Sound of BeauSoleil Back To Spokane

For centuries, music carried the history and soul of a culture. Michael Doucet grew up in Louisiana surrounded by his elders and neighbors singing Acadian folk songs.

"It was no big deal playing Cajun music," he remembered when he received an NEA National Heritage Fellowship. "It wasn't until

Tips and Tricks to Get the Best FM Radio Reception

The hills and mountains that make the Inland Northwest a beautiful place to live can also make it harder to clearly hear KPBX and KSFC. SPR Chief Engineer Jerry Olson has some suggestions to improve your reception.

KPBX 91.1 Spokane comes from Mica Peak, just south of Liberty Lake at the state line. KSFC 91.9's transmitter is at Lookout Mountain, near Nine Mile. Additional repeaters and translators carry the signal further across the Inland Northwest, see a list of frequencies on the back flap of this Guide.



Radios with a rod antenna pick up FM signals best at a low angle or horizontal.

FM radio signals are line-of-sight and will be blocked or degraded when encountering solid things, such as hills and buildings. Your FM radio receiver works best near a window, especially one facing your local transmitter.

All radios need an antenna. Most radios today use either the power cord or earbud/headphones as an antenna, which aren't as powerful

Michael Doucet & BeauSoleil Continued from front panel

Today, the fiddler, composer and bandleader is arguably the most important figure in modern Cajun music. He and his group, BeauSoleil, have traveled the world sharing their down-home good-time music. They return to Spokane on Thursday, October 5, 2017 at 7:30 p.m. for a concert benefiting Spokane Public Radio at the Martin Woldson Theater at The Fox.

"We were the first group to actually perform in all 50 states in a foreign language and convince people they were listening to American music," Doucet says.

Cajun music is rooted in the songs and fiddle tunes of the Acadians — French speakers who migrated first to Canada and then to Louisiana. It combines elements of jazz, blues, bluegrass and swing. The result is a uniquely regional American music.

Doucet appeared on Garrison Keillor's *A Prairie Home Companion* several times, and even received

as a real rod. An inexpensive "T"-shaped dipole antenna can make a big difference, placed as high as possible. Pre-digital (VHF)TV antennas can also work. The entire FM band lies between analog TV channels 6 and 7.

If a radio is simply out of range, any internet device can access the stations of SPR through our website, SpokanePublicRadio.org. Click on the blue "Listen Live" button in the upper right corner and choose from the KPBX, KSFC, or KPBZ services.


