Thursday, May 8, 2014, 7:30 p.m. at the Bing, 901 W. Sprague

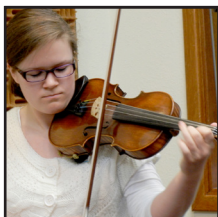

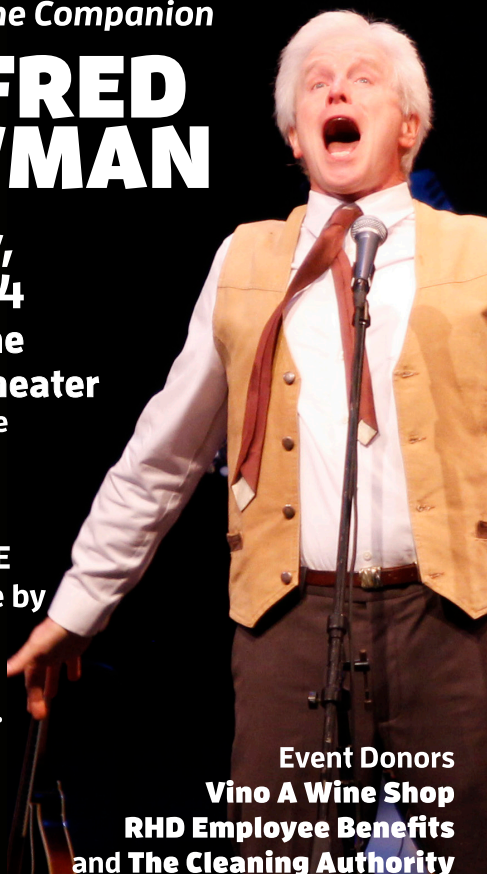
