Changes coming to SPR for 2018

The New Year brings several significant changes to the program lineup of Spokane Public Radio. Starting on January 1st *A Prairie Home Companion* will be replaced on Saturday afternoons on KPBX 91.1 with *Live Wire* from Portland, OR at 3 pm

and *The Moth Radio Hour* at 4 pm. Our Sunday lineup will now include *Inland Folk* with Dan Maher in its three-hour entirety from 6 to 9 pm, followed by *Soundspace* with Zan Agzigian from 9 to 11 pm. Folk Alley will join the afternoon lineup at 3 pm.

On KSFC 91.9, *Native America Calling* will move from 10 am weekdays, when it airs live, to 9 pm. The show can still be heard live on KPBZ 90.3. The 10 am weekday KSFC slot will be repopulated with *On the Media*, *TED Talks*, *Reveal*, *Innovation Hub*, and *Big Picture Science*.

General Manager Cary Boyce says that issues of pricing, audience, and retirements are driving such programming changes across the country. "We live in a time of significant changes in public broadcasting.
