Dear Wisconsin Resident,

A few years ago, we sent out a survey concerning **wolf policy** to which you kindly responded. Today we are writing to ask for your help once again in shaping future wolf policy in Wisconsin.

Why?

Since wolves were federally de-listed as an endangered species in 2012, they are now managed as a game species by the state. The first annual wolf hunting and trapping season took place this past fall and winter 2012. We are sending this survey to residents of Wisconsin to learn opinions of wolves and wolf management in the state. As a resident of Wisconsin, **your opinion is very important to us**. We will share our results with you, the media, policy-makers, and managers in our state.

We include \$2 as a token of appreciation for your time. This money is yours to keep, even if you do not participate.
